Research by National Centre for Social Research found that 47% of 14 year olds and 41% of 15 year olds reported being bullied. Cyber bullying is also increasing with bullying by mobiles, email and websites now as common as name-calling among teenagers. Bullying within relationships, homophobia and sexual and sexist bullying are also major issues for many schools.


